

This field card is based on the decisions of the Bird Records Committee of the Alabama Ornithological Society as of September 2025. Sightings of species boldfaced or listed as "Category B" (formerly "Hypothetical") should be submitted with full written details (and physical evidence such as photos or voice recordings if available). Italicized species often require brief written details listing the diagnostic points used in the identification. Out-of-season and locally rare birds also need documentation. Reports should either be sent to Greg D. Jackson (AOS Bird Records Curator: g_d_jackson@bellsouth.net) or submitted through eBird.

Species marked as "N" are known to have attempted nesting in the state. Those listed as "Category B" have sightings with acceptable documentation, but are not validated by physical evidence (e.g. specimens or photographs) or have not been verified by several experienced observers. Taxonomy follows the seventh edition of the American Ornithology Society's *Check-list of North American Birds* (through the 66th Supplement, July 2025).
